
The Reverend Ivan Howitt

The Guild is very sad to announce the death of the Reverend Ivan Howitt, who passed away on the 3rd January 2024 after a short illness. A Service of Thanksgiving for Ivan will take place on Saturday 10th February 2024 at 2pm. It will be held at their local Church, St Mary's, Barton on Humber DN18 5EZ. The Guild offers its sincere condolences to Valerie, Ivan's wife, and their family, over their loss.

Ivan was a much respected and loved member of the Guild. His lively, thoughtful, and warmly received contributions made over a very long period will be remembered by all with whom he had association. He joined the Guild in 1988, served as Guild secretary between 2007 and 2012, becoming Vice President in 2016 and again in 2023. In more recent years, Ivan also undertook to administer the Guild Facebook pages, adding items of interest, the RW Thought for the Week written by members, and many photographs of Guild activities past and present. Ivan successfully rang some 13 peals for the Guild between 1989 and 2008, ranging from minor to royal, and including one at Hedon, York, on becoming the vicar there.


His higher education was at the University of Kent, gaining a BA in 1981, and the Sarum and Wells Theological College. He commenced his first curacy at Herne Bay, Canterbury in 1983 and his second on the Isle of Thanet in 1987. Between 1990 and 2003, Ivan held several incumbencies in the Diocese of Lincoln including for 8 years as the Rural Dean of Lawres. For a shorter period, he was also a Chaplain to the Seafarers Mission at Hull. In 2003, Ivan was appointed as vicar of Hedon, in the Diocese of York. Leaving Hedon in 2009, Ivan joined the Harton Benefice, not far from York itself, becoming Rector of the Group in 2012. Retiring in 2013, but with permission to officiate in both York and Lincoln Dioceses, Ivan and Valerie, moved finally to Barton upon Humber, North Lincolnshire.

We express our gratitude to Ivan, not only for his long service to many as an ordained priest in the Church of England but also as a bell ringer where he graced us with his presence, his fine ringing skills, good humour, and pastoral support. May he now rest in peace and rise in glory. Amen.



Ringing in West Yorkshire beyond Leeds

The Western branch of the Yorkshire Association is unmanageably large. To reach Saddleworth from my home on the west side of Bradford is an 80-minute drive from here under ideal road conditions. However, in a little over ten miles, we can ring at two twelves, one by Gilletts, one by Taylors. In addition, in that radius, we have three more Gillett eights and three Taylor eights. I have come back from ringing tours thinking how blessed we are here with Halifax and Bradford, Skipton and Keighley in reach.


"Too many bells, too few ringers" comments one local tower captain, although six of the eight towers ring for services on Sunday.

Bradford Cathedral is an exception. We have occasionally managed to put together a band from the District for Sunday afternoon/evening services. The Leeds Minster band has rung for services occasionally too. The Young Tykes will have rung for the Bradford Civic Carol Service this year. I am trying to keep the connection between church services and bells alive. Plenty want to ring peals or practice for the twelvebell competition. The bells had Taylor's check in 2018 and are due one next year. We are fortunate to have had several good ringers with leadership skills move into the district within the last few years. The general standard of ringing is improving. At a monthly Surprise Major practice, we regularly ring Cornwall. Handbells are happening. I have rung six quarter peals last year, mainly with people trying Bob

Major or Bob Triples for the first time, also my first peal for a while for the Coronation. The Mid Pennine ringers, a group of retired people who ring, meet monthly for a couple of towers and lunch. They are my only opportunity to ring London Surprise Major and sometimes Spliced. I'm persuaded that quite a number of towers are kept going by this group.

Come and join us. The bells are good, the rate of exchange of the pound is excellent and we are on the edge of some of the finest scenery in England.

The Guild Annual 2024 Low Week Tour (LWT) - Monday 8th to Friday 12th April





The Voice of the Church: publication 2023



Our joint publication with the Ringing World (RW) continues to be purchased in small

numbers and receives very good reports. Talking with Will Bosworth, Ringing World editor, we came up with the idea that if you are part of an area association/guild gathering or other ringing events, then Will could make available small quantities of the book on a sale or return basis. This is worth thinking about. It came up recently when one of our members pending: Rhona McCune (set for Ordination this summer) sought copies of the book for her fellow ordinands on a training course. This is just the kind of largely non-ringing group who should read the publication and inwardly digest it!
